We welcome your application. You can send it to us on online, in person, by post (using our application form) or through an education representative (for international students).

Year 12 students

As a Year 12 student completing your Higher School Certificate (HSC) in NSW, you may [apply to us directly](#), as we do not use the Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking (ATAR) for admission to our courses. Instead, we use the average mark from the HSC results, calculated from your results in English and three non-Vocation Education & Training (VET) HSC subjects.
